The theme for Mr. Hudnut's presentation is "Working Together Sure Beats Competing Separately." Mr. Hudnut is best known for his 16-year tenure as Mayor of Indianapolis, where he led the public-private partnership that generated a dramatic revitalization of that city. He has also served as a Congressman, clergyman, and author. He is deeply involved in regional issues across the US as Senior Resident Fellow for Public Policy at the Urban Land Institute. He is author of *Halfway to Everywhere*, a lively first-hand report on how America's first tier suburbs are faring, and *Cities on the Rebound: A Vision for Urban America*. At the core of *Cities* is Hudnut's vision for dealing with diversity, encouraging sustainable development, finding alternatives to sprawl, managing technological change, persuading cities and suburbs to collaborate, improving government efficiency, and urging citizens to participate as advocates, rather than adversaries.
